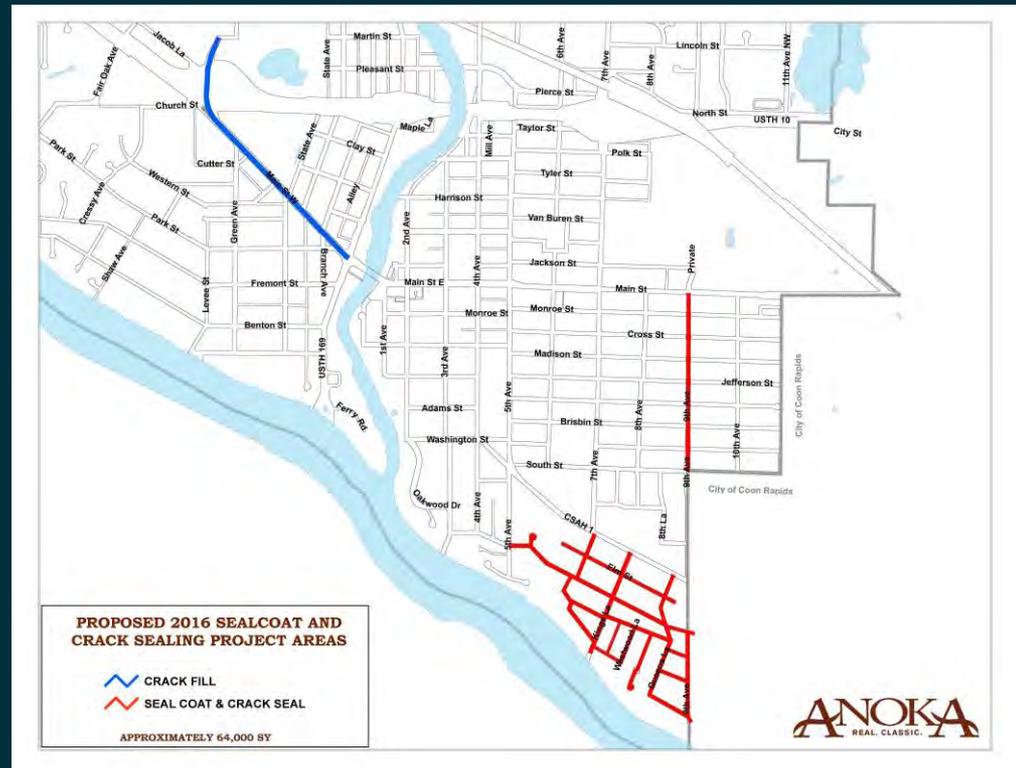

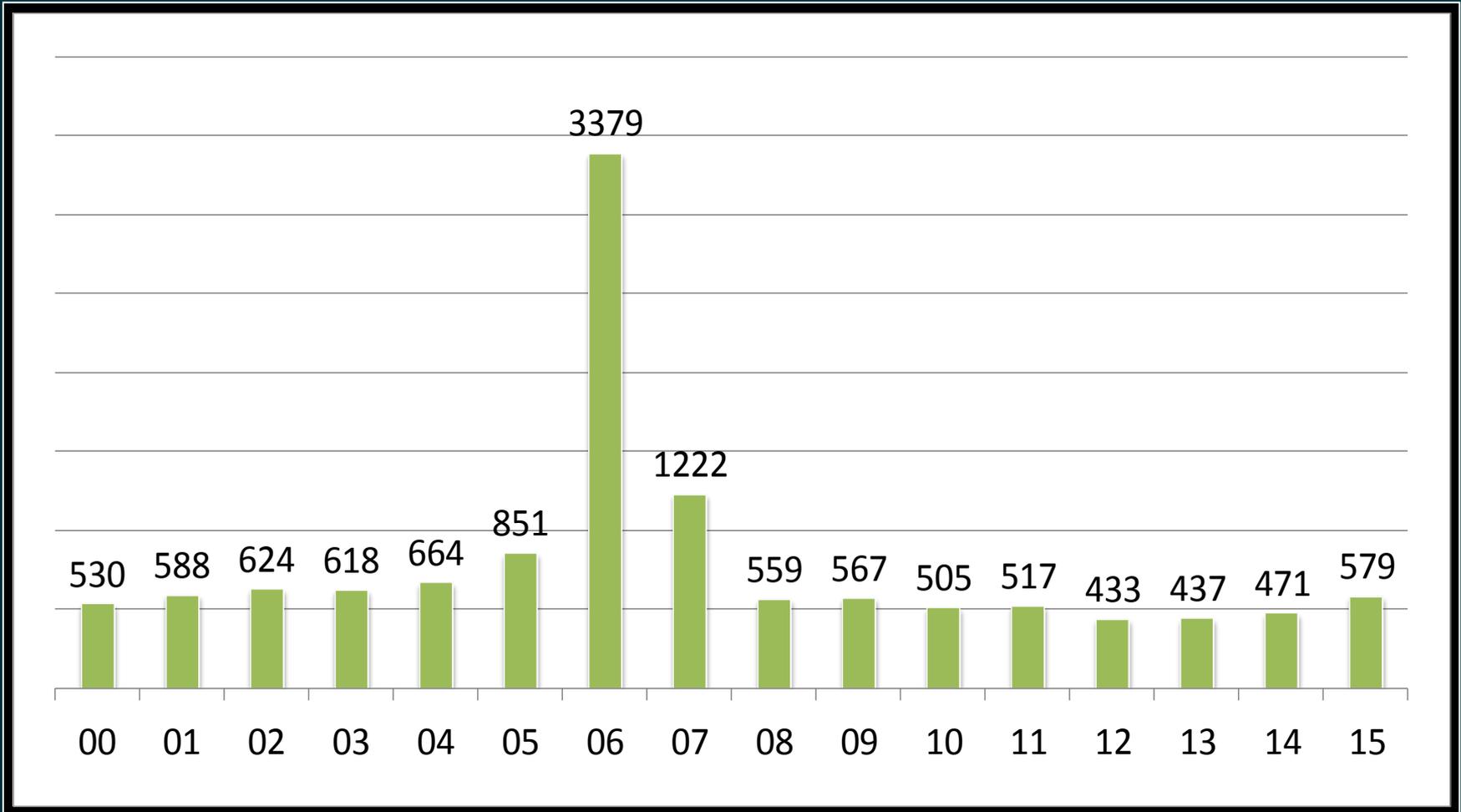

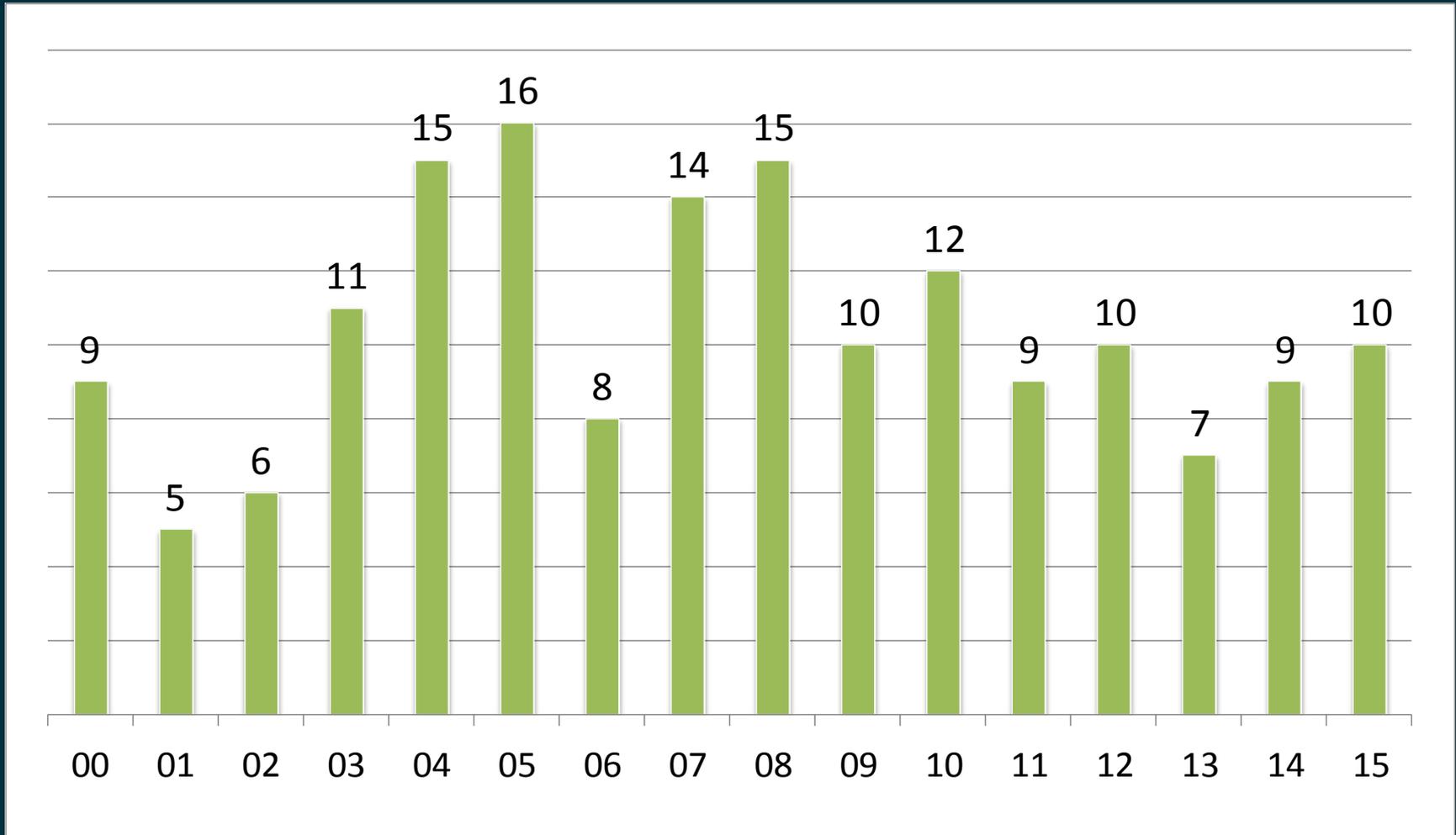
Building Permits *(not including mechanical, electrical, or plumbing)*

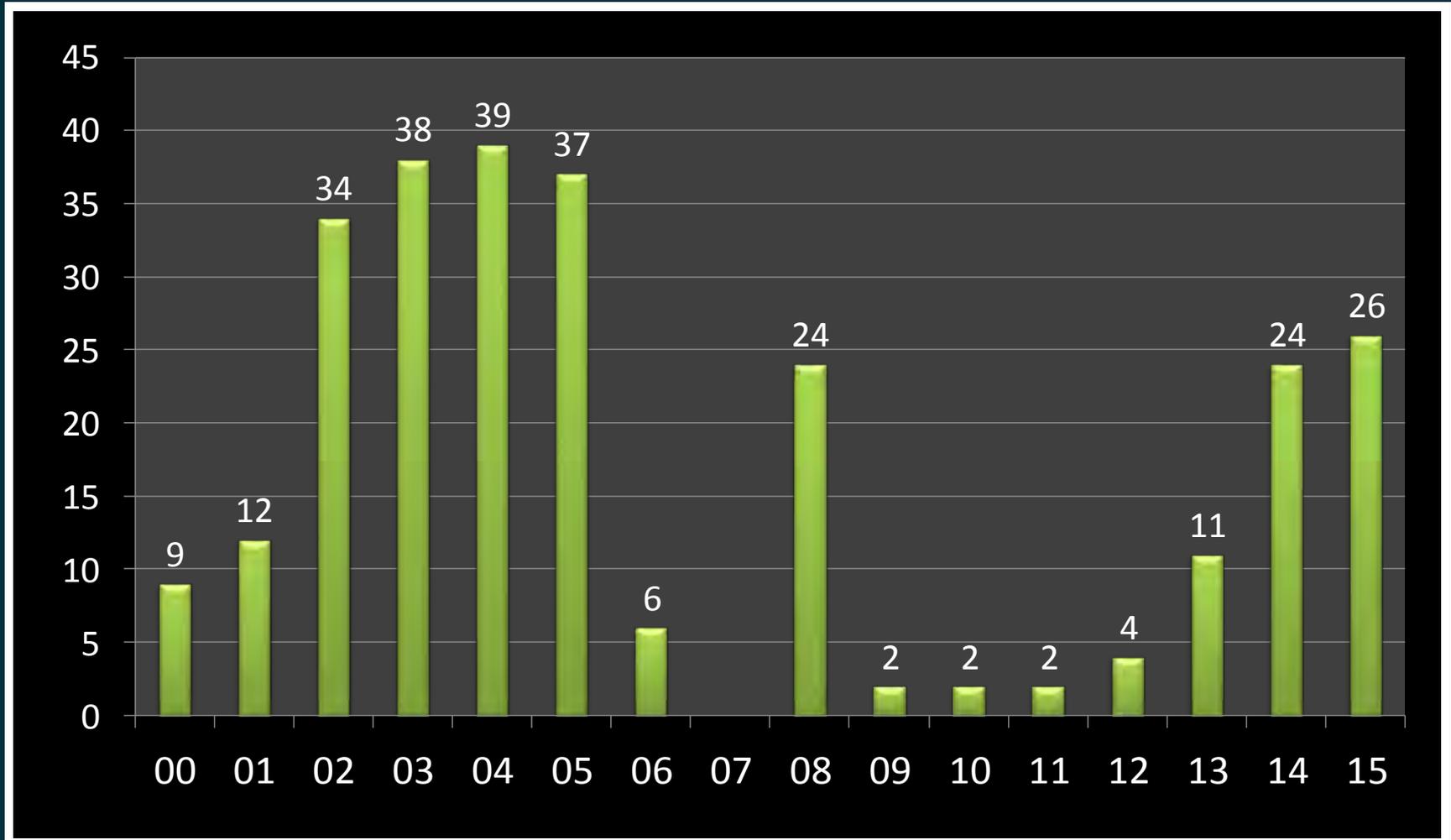

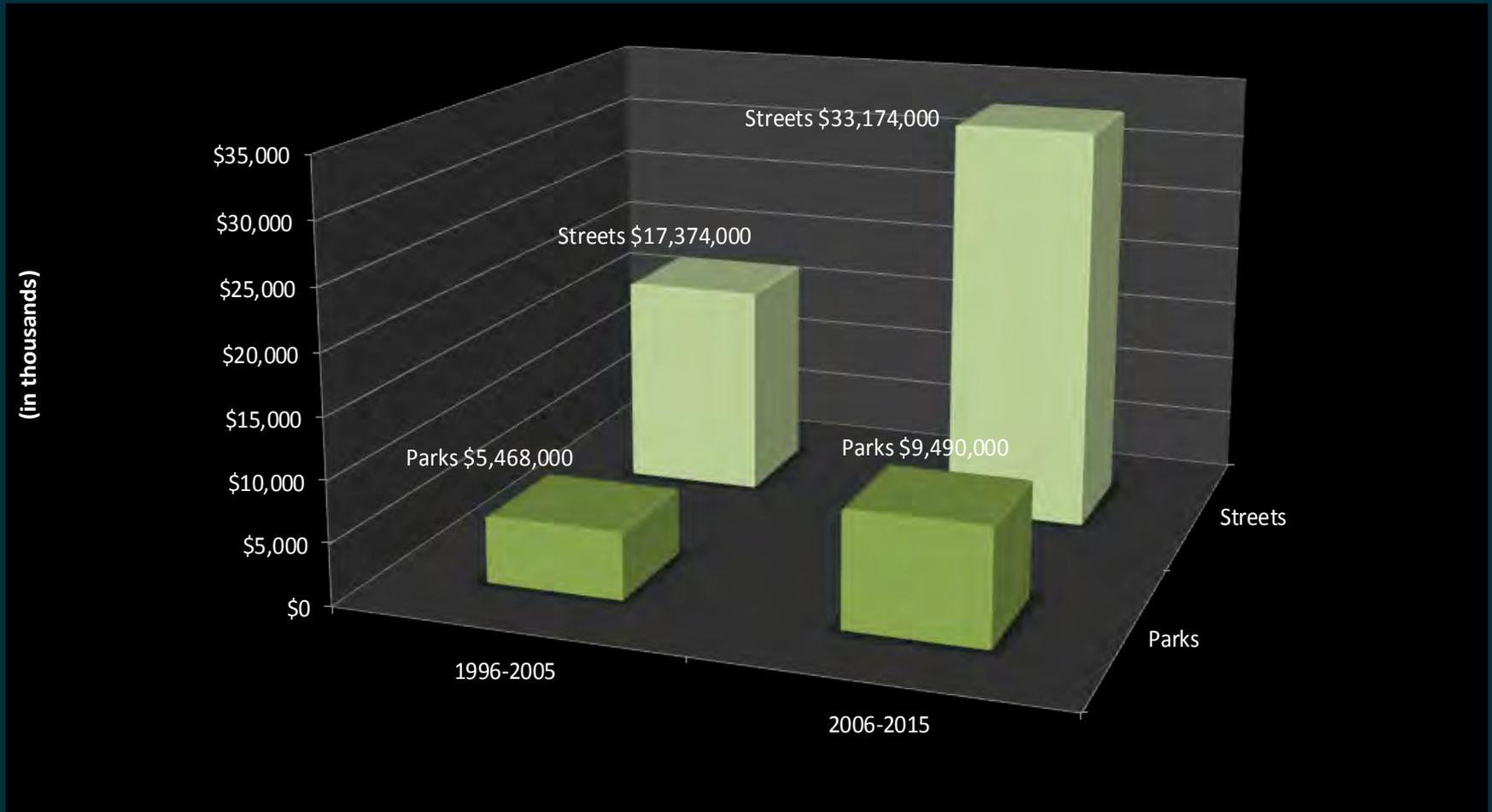

Capital Spending (adjusted for inflation)

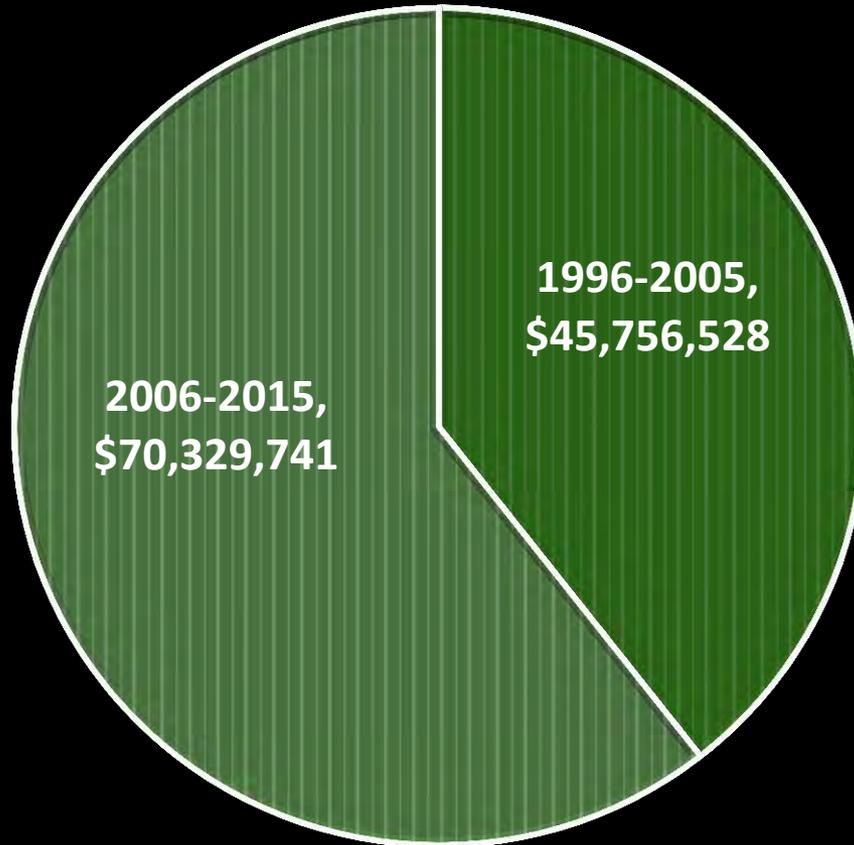

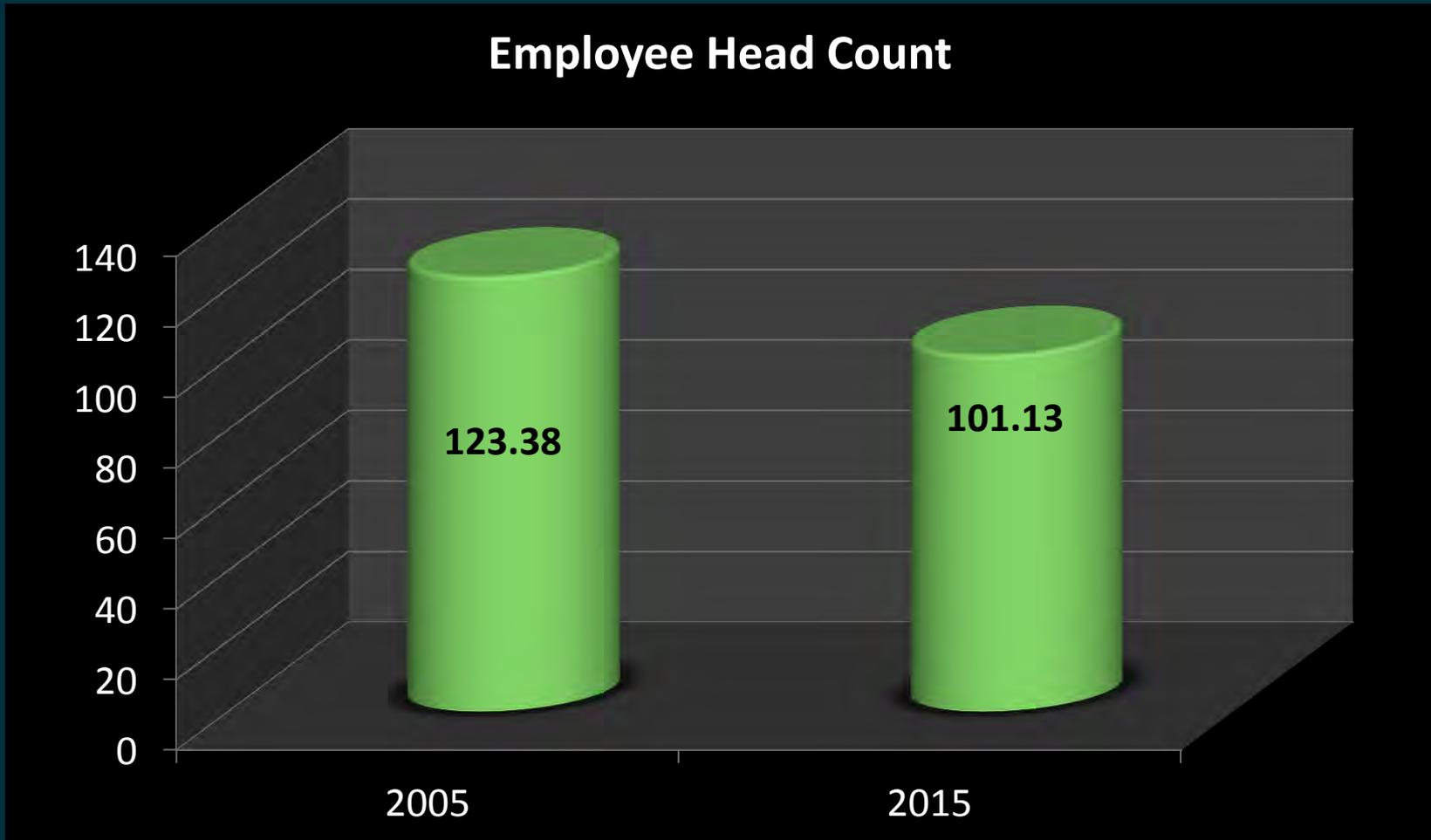


All Capital Improvements & Infrastructure (actual dollars)

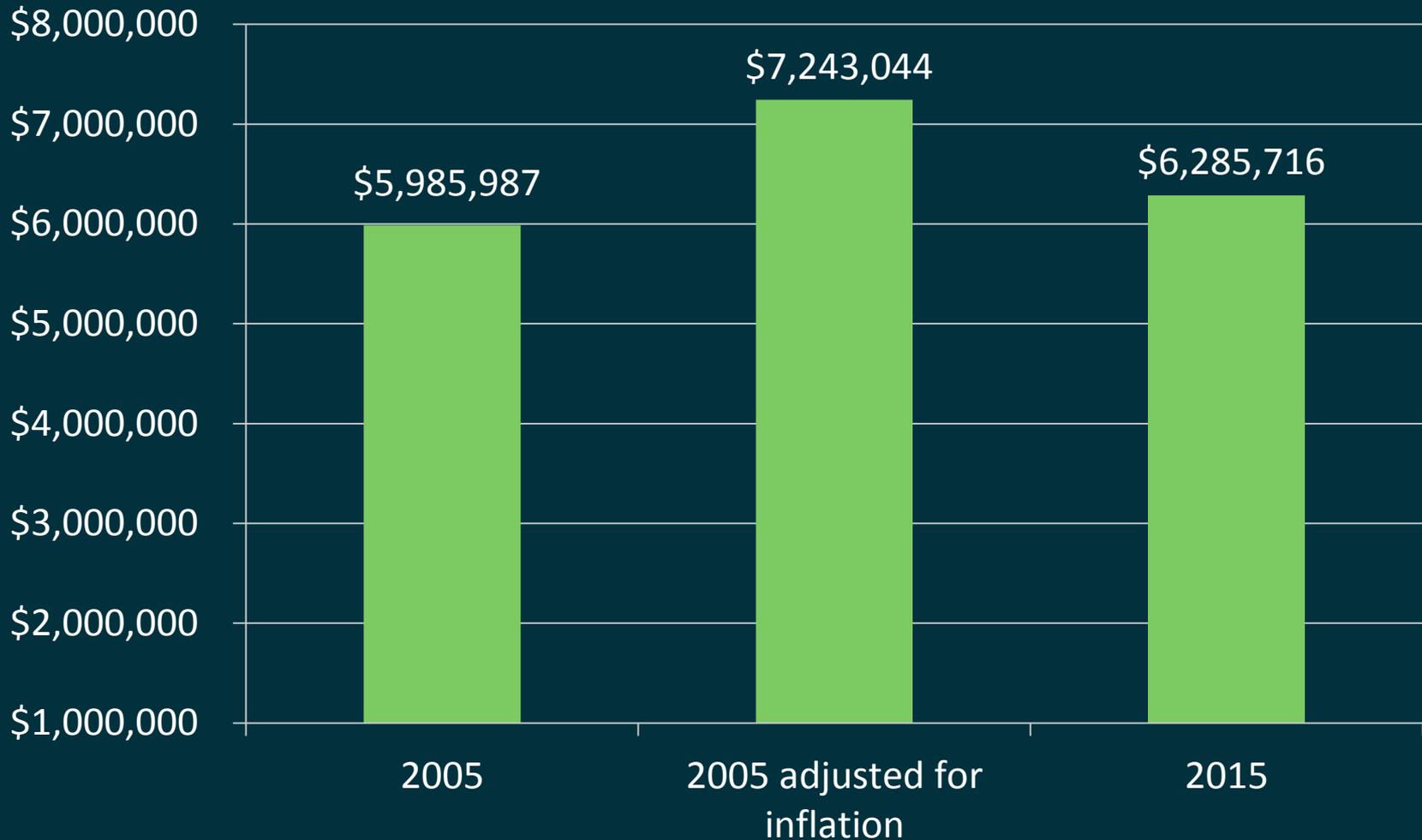

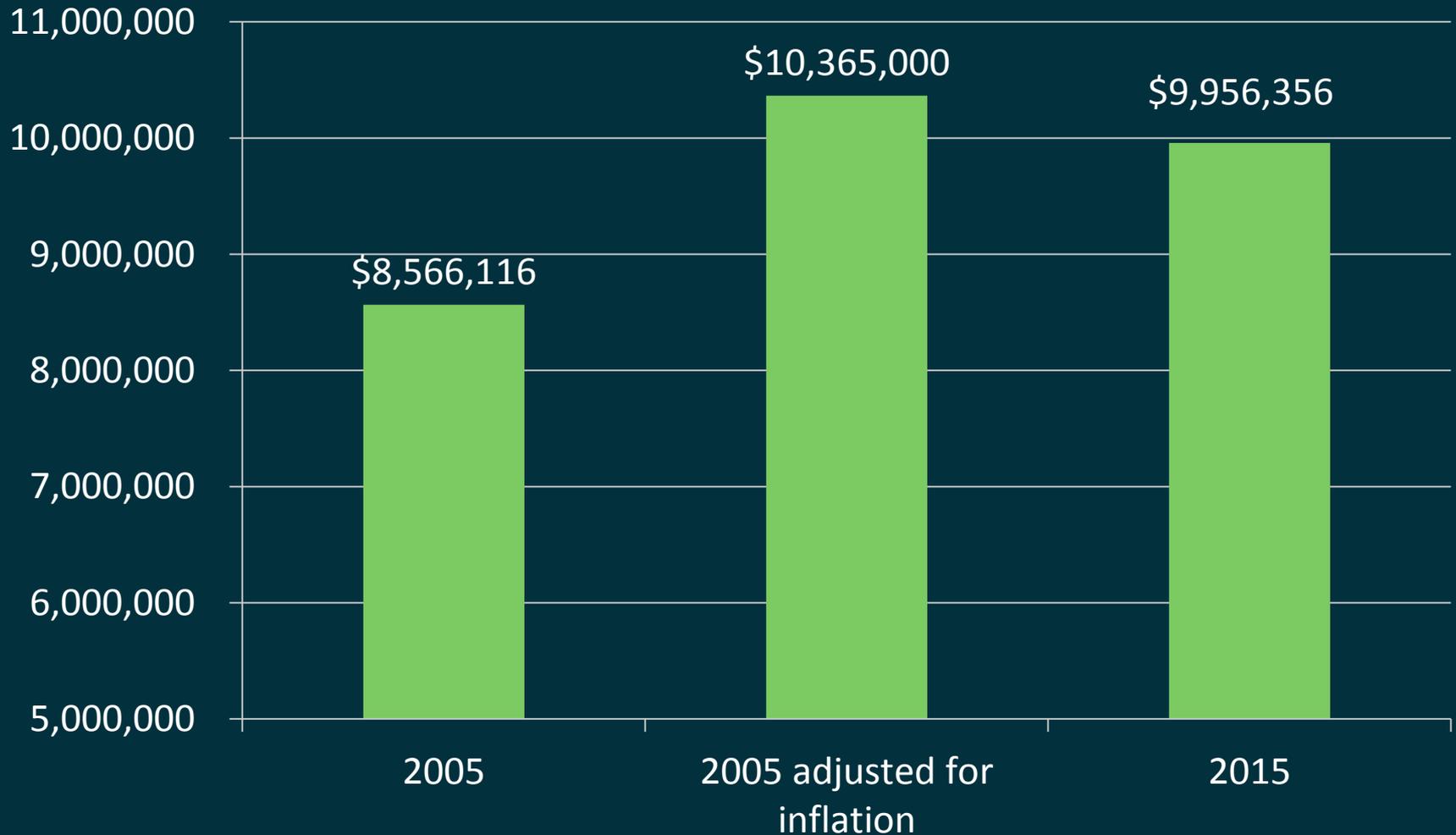
General Fund – Salary & Benefits

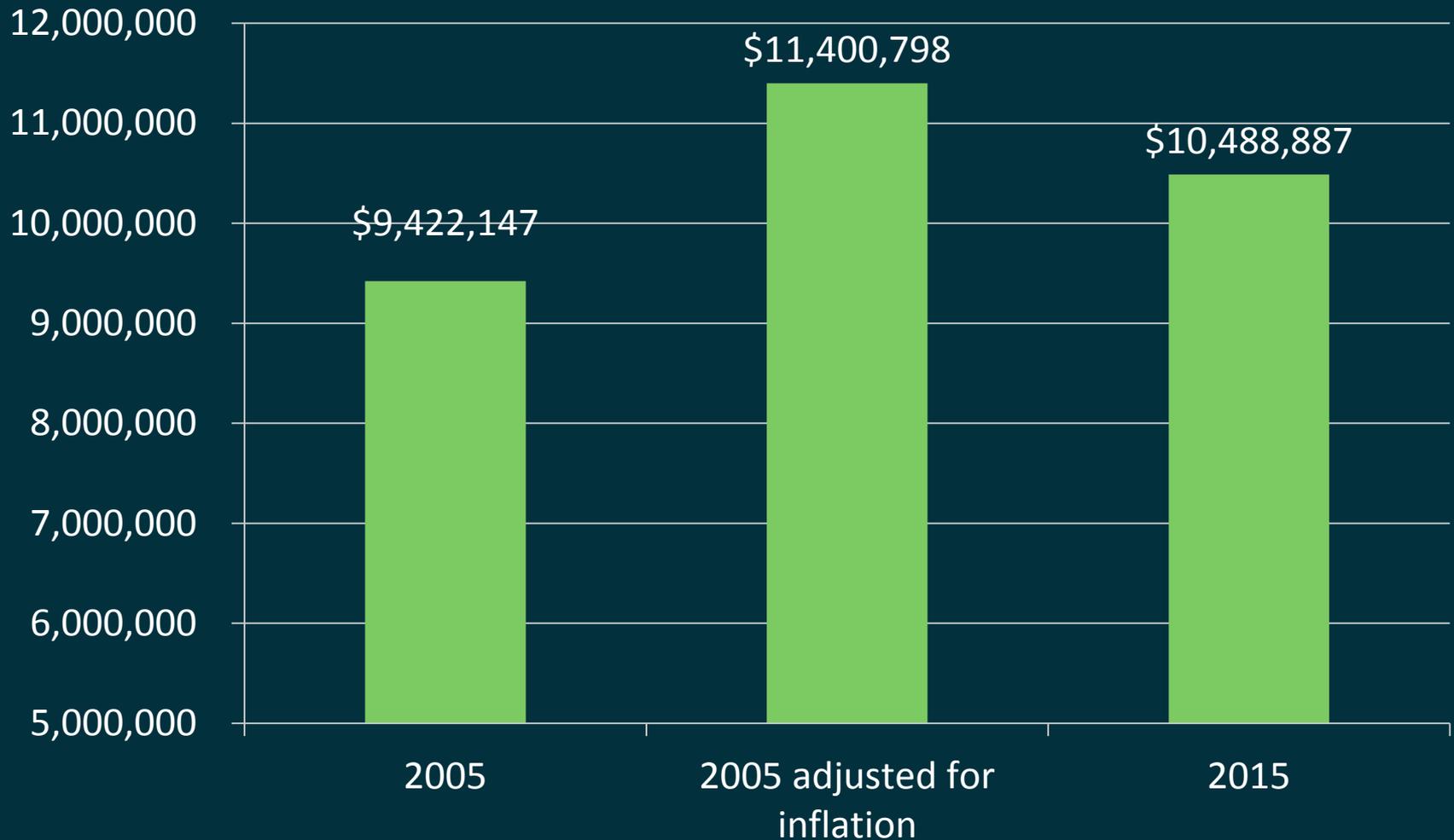
General Fund Expenditures *(excluding transfers out)*

General Fund Revenue *(excluding transfers in)*

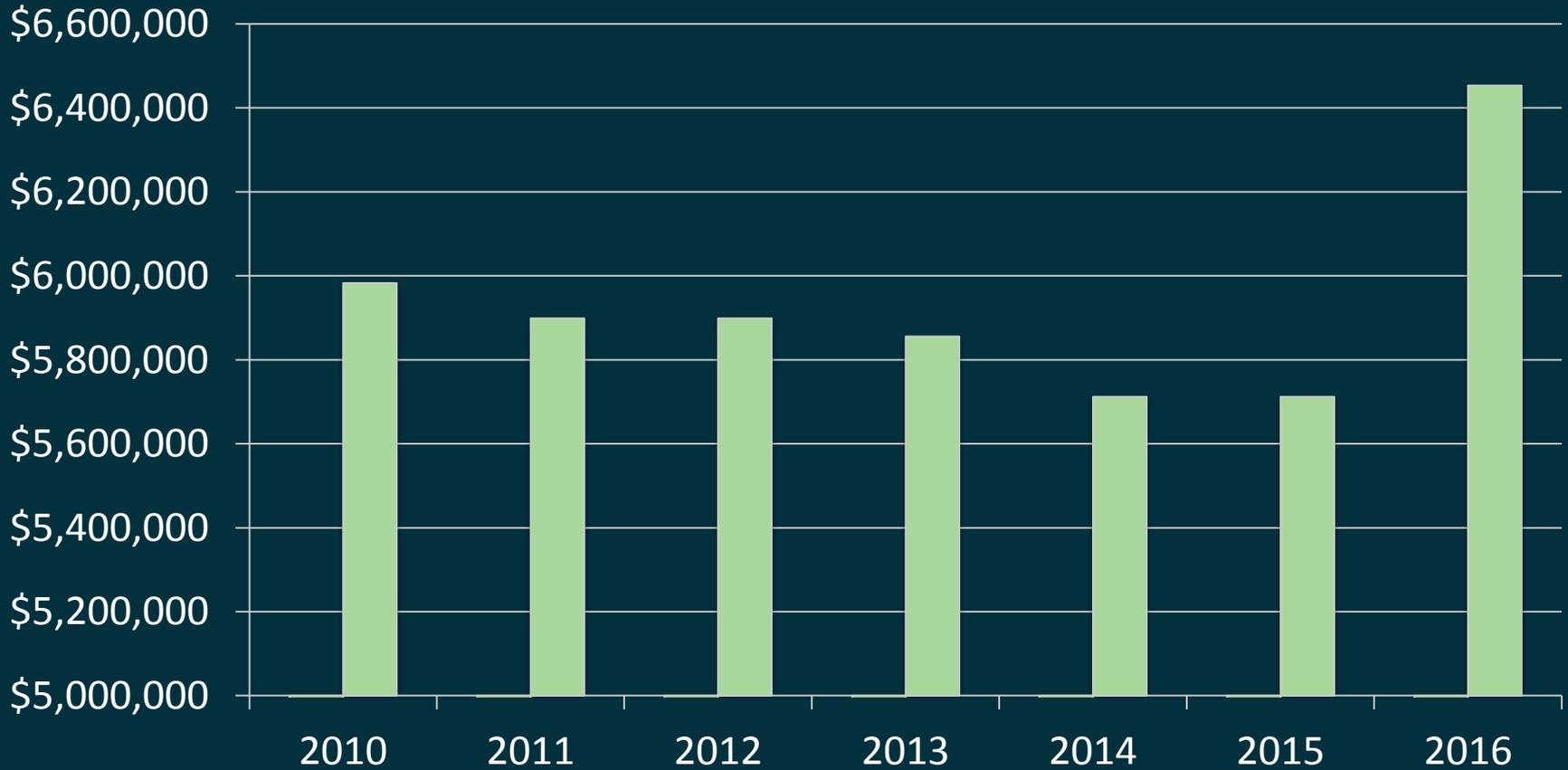

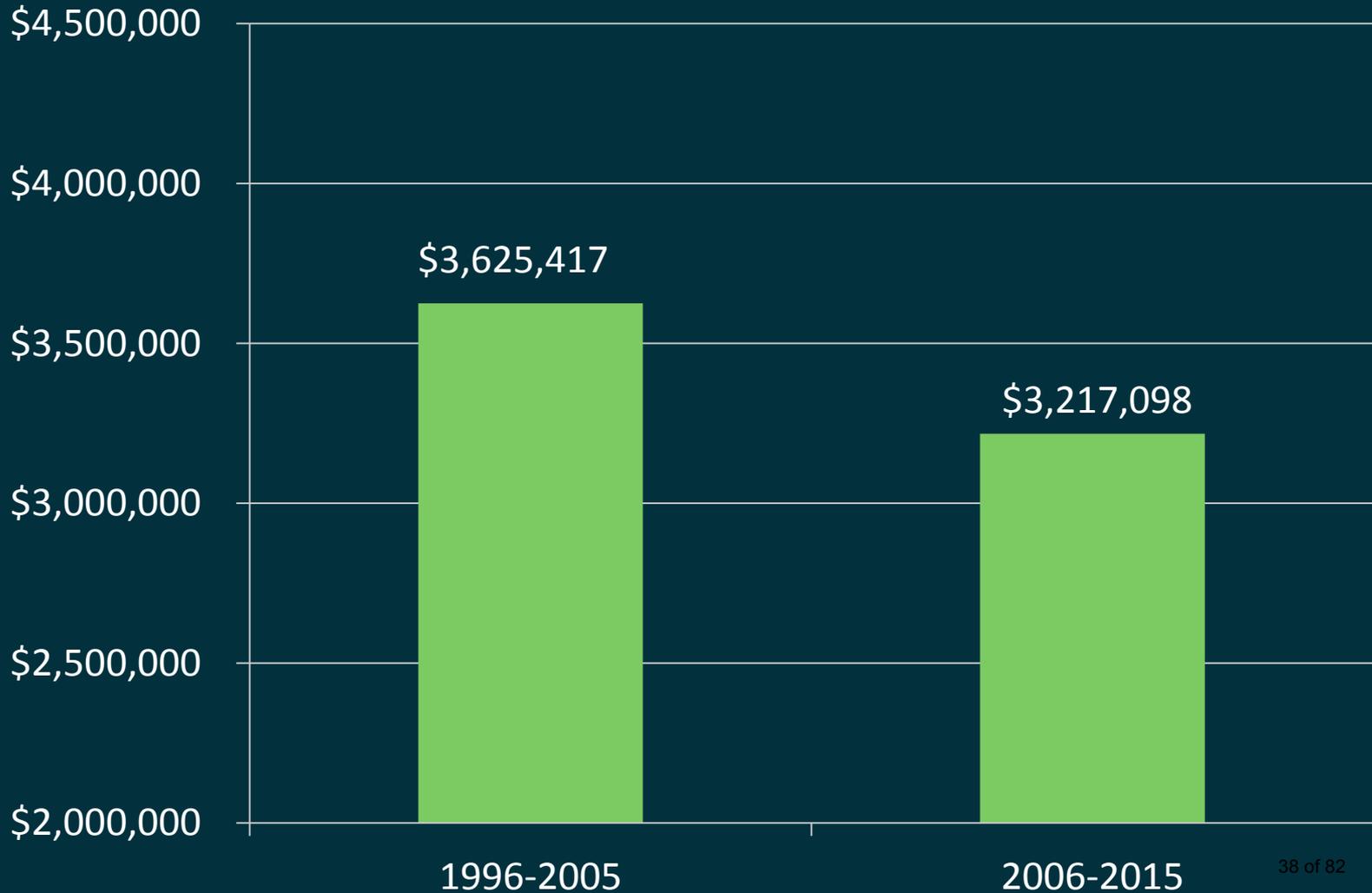

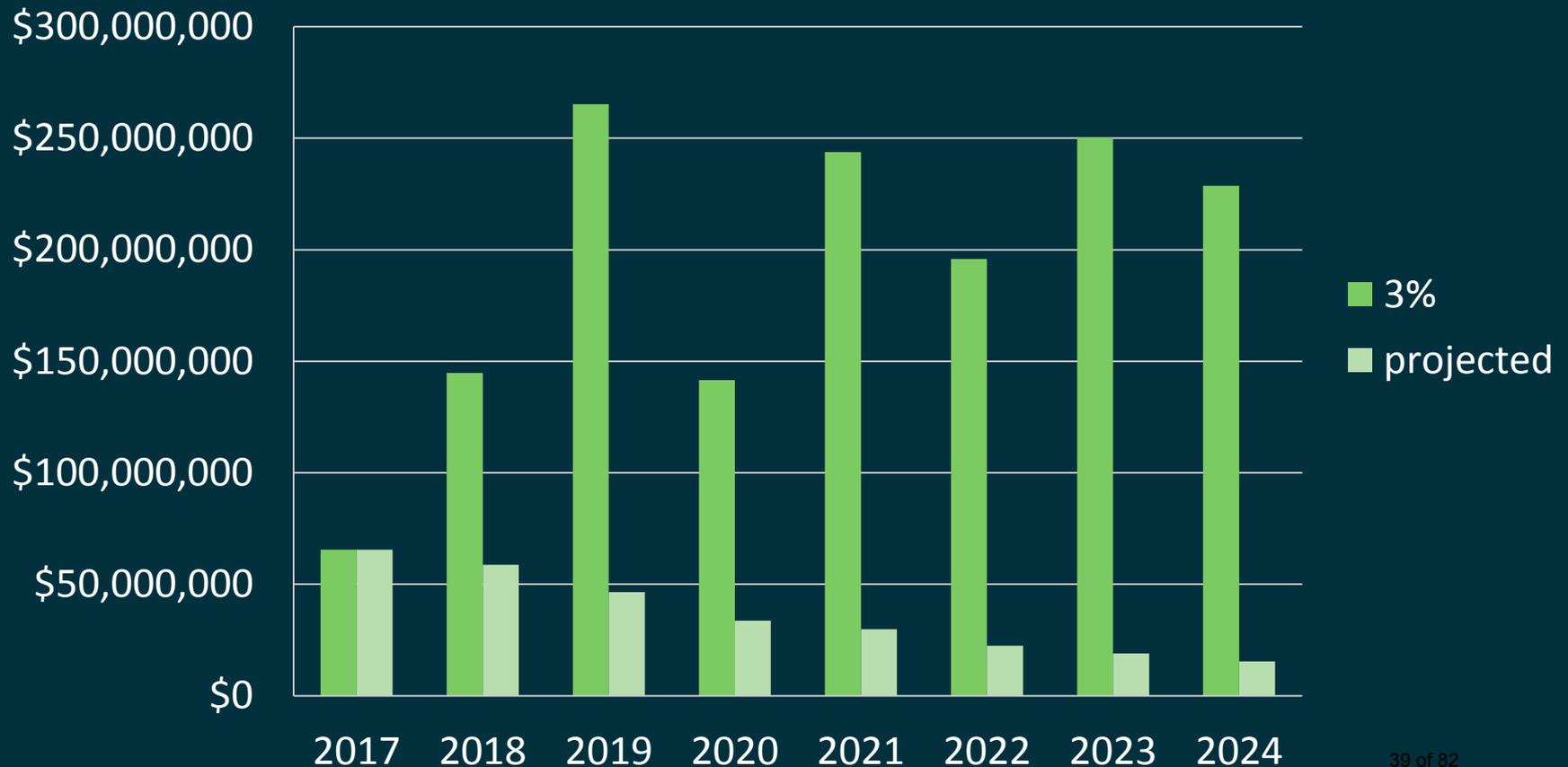
License & Permit Revenue – Adjusted for Inflation
